Minutes of the Molalla City Council Town Hall Meeting Molalla Adult Center 315 Kennel Ave., Molalla, OR 97038 Wednesday December 10, 2014

ATTENDANCE: Mayor Rogge, Present; Councilor Pottle, Present; Councilor Thompson, Present; Councilor Cook, Present; Councilor Griswold, Present; Councilor Boreth, Present.

STAFF IN ATTENDANCE: City Manager Dan Huff, Present; City Recorder Sadie Cramer, Present; Police Chief Lucich, Present.

City Manager Huff showed some slides that showed some problems caused by the homeless and transients. The City's focus is on safety and awareness in public places.

Chief Lucich stated that the City wants to come up with a positive solution.

Brenda Durbin, Director of Clackamas County Social Services stated that homelessness is in every city in Clackamas County. She advised the services available through Clackamas County to help the homeless.

Leota Childres, Chairman of the Molalla Warming Center Committee advised that they were able to get one of Molalla's chronic homeless person into housing through Clackamas County. She shared some information on feeding the homeless.

Steven Morrison stated that there are few programs for feeding the homeless. There are no overnight shelters, other than domestic violence shelters.

Mitch Jorgenson asked if there were any programs specifically aimed at mentally challenged homeless. Ms. Durbin advised that if people can sign up for affordable health care, they will have coverage for mental health issues.

Councilor Pottle asked where the homeless youth go. Ms. Durbin advised that Clackamas County has access to 45 houses for homeless to stay in. Peggy Savage stated that there is a homeless youth liaison at Molalla High School to assist the youth.

Councilor Thompson stated that he would like to have addressed the issues that the public has over the parks in Molalla.

Table #1 - Brenda Durbin and Councilor Thompson

Question #1 - It was determined that the majority of the people that come to the warming center are residents of Molalla. Transportation was discussed and the ways that Tri-Met could assist. Mayor Rogge asked if there could be a case worker assigned specifically to Molalla. Brenda advised that she will contact Clackamas County with that request. It was mentioned that because the church community in Molalla is so strong, there could be a list of resources that the church's offer.

Question #2 - In regards to the parks, if the public feels intimidated by the people in the park, call the police.

Question #3 - Councilor Thompson stated that the warming center has restrictions. There is a code of conduct form that must be signed.

Table #2 – Councilor Griswold

Question #1 – Metro has a call #211, to get information on services that are available.

Question #2 – A neighborhood watch for the park areas. Also discussed was more camera's in the parks. Park improvements, trimming trees, more lighting and fencing.

Question #3 – Classify the troublemakers. Get the information to the warming center, etc.

Question #4 – Adopt a park. Get information back to Public Works and the Police Dept.

Question #5 – Contact 911 if drug use is being seen. Proactive communication between the schools and law enforcement.

Table #3 – Councilor Boreth

This table had a member of the Police Dept., Clackamas County, Teacher and Public Works Dept.

Suggestions for solutions:

An Ordinance restricting tobacco in the parks and an Ordinance restricting sleeping in the parks.

Post the non-emergency dispatch 503-655-8211 and 211 for County services in the parks and in the monthly utility bills. Also post in the parks numbers for narcotics anonymous, AA and mental health help offered through Clackamas County.

Table #4 – Councilor Cook

Question #1 – Look into an outpatient facility for mental health issues in Molalla. There is a passion for not turning away someone that needs a meal, even if they are breaking the law. There are two groups of people, the homeless that are in dire straits and the ones that are transients.

Providing information for services, hand out business cards with numbers to Clackamas County. Posting signs by the cameras with non-emergency phone numbers.

A question was asked regarding the statistics on crimes, have they increased of the past few years.

Table #5 – Councilor Pottle

Councilor Pottle thanked everyone that attended the Town Hall.

The citizens of Molalla need to get involved. Citizen watch programs, bring the DARE program back, create youth programs, and apply for grants for these programs. Mayor Rogge stated that all of the comments and suggestions will be turned in and compiled and given to the City Manager.

Fiscal Impact: Low bidding quote: \$36,360.06

Background:

To meet NPDES regulatory requirements and reduce or remove Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) impacts to the Sanitary Collections system, the City requests approval for purchase of 7 flow meters, hardware and accessories as proceed with work as identified in the Brown and Caldwell, Scope of Services recently approved by council.

Bids were solicited from three suppliers and the following two comparable bids were received:

- Bainbridge Associates, Inc. quoted Hach Monitoring systems totaling \$36,360.06
- Whitney Equipment Company, Inc. quoted ISCO monitoring systems totaling \$39,514.00

The City recommends approval for purchase of the low bid from Bainbridge Associates, Inc. In addition to being the lowest bidder, the Hach systems provides the capability of extracting flow data for analysis to the commonly used Excel application without additional purchase of software. Both monitoring systems are comparable in monitoring collection system flows.
