- Please keep in mind that Molalla is the center of a rural community and not Lake Oswego or Hillsboro when you're planning what the city needs. We need to be open to new business by making things easy to do to get them here and not chase them away by making it difficult and expensive to locate here.
- Council needs to do their homework and not just "go with the flow". People who have
 businesses in Molalla but live outside of the city get dinged for taxes and fees, when they don't
