- Negotiate a Park Site in Big Meadows
- Addition of land from Clackamas County to Ivor Davies Park
- Rail Line Trail
- Bear Creek Trail
- Open Space area behind Plaza Los Robles
- Develop a Park and Recreation CIP (Capital Improvement Plan)
- Discussion on funding for parks
