Hi Mike,

I was doing some draft RPAs for the city of Molalla in anticipation of their permit renewal in 2023 and I noticed that in ICIS/NetDMR they reported some very, very high daily maximum and high 7 day average effluent temperatures for January, February, and March (in the 100s of degrees C). Given just how high the temperatures are and the fact that this is a domestic wastewater treatment plant I have a feeling that this may likely be a data entry error. Unless the permittee confirms and corrects the error I will need to use the officially reported data in the RPAs for permit renewal, which may result in the permittee getting a limit for analytes like pH and ammonia.

As the compliance inspector, would you be able to reach out to the permittee and confirm if this is a data error and have the permittee correct the issue in NetDMR?
